WATT, J., DISSENTING:

¶1 From all of the documents, exhibits, affidavits, and pleadings presented, I have grave concerns that the petitioner has failed to receive even the minimal due process required under our state and federal constitutions.

¶2 The failure to inform the petitioner of the Hillcrest subpoena that was issued more than six months previous; numerous ex parte continuances obtained by the respondents, again without notice to the petitioner; the attempt to extend authority to the Trial Examiner to hear evidence beyond that authorized by the O.A.C.; and several possible conflicts of interest among members of the respondent's "trial team" all warrant assumption of original jurisdiction by this court.

¶3 Accordingly, I would assume original jurisdiction, stay all pending proceedings, and assign this matter to a justice to await any further orders by this court as may be warranted after a full examination and review of the record herein.

¶4 Therefore, I respectfully dissent to the court's refusal to assume original jurisdiction by today's pronouncement.
